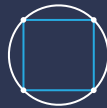

Most importantly, participants will make new contacts and develop new relationships to support their own work in the health industry.


