



Traffic in Transit (GATT Article V)

Goods (including baggage), and also vessels and other means of transport, shall be deemed to be in transit across the territory of a contracting party when the passage across such territory, with or without trans-shipment, warehousing, breaking bulk, or change in the mode of transport, is only a portion of a complete journey beginning and terminating beyond the frontier of the contracting party across whose territory the traffic passes.

National Transit







Transit for exportation

transportation from an inland Customs office to an office of exit

Internal transit

transportation from one inland Customs office to another inland Customs office.

Transit for importation

transportation from an office of entry to an inland office

LLDCs and difficulties

The costs to export and import from/to LLDCs are on average more than twice the costs to export and import from/to transit developing countries

The level of development of average LLDC is 20% lower than the development of average coastal countries.

Efficient Transit system is essential for economic development of LLDCs.

Freedom of Transit

GATT Article V, paragraph 2

2. There shall be freedom of transit through the territory of each contracting party, via the routes most convenient for international transit, for traffic in transit to or from the territory of other contracting parties.

Principles of freedom of Transit

- 1. No distinction
- 2. Prohibition of unnecessary delay and restriction
- 3. Prohibition to levy Customs duties
- 4. Reasonable charges
- 5. No less favourable Treatment

Freedom of Transit by TFA

More Principles of freedom of Transit – TFA Article 11

- 1. Less trade restrictive regulation or formalities
- 2. No disguised restriction
- 3. charges = administrative expenses entitled by transit or cost of service rendered
- 4. No voluntary restrains
- 5. Strengthened non-discrimination




