Why parents supply a sip in early adolescence: Bad parenting or protecting their child?

This leaves the questions...

Why do parents supply a sip of alcohol?

And does this sip increase their child's risk of drinking?

 Australian Parental Supply of Alcohol Longitudinal Study: Grade 7 students, and one parent recruited nationally via secondary schools.



 19 variables (parenting practices, family environment, adolescent behaviour, peers, demographics) from Grade 7 tested in adjusted models of Grade 8 data (N=1729 dyads).

What didn't predict parental supply of a sip?

 Table 1. Grade 7 factors with no association with Grade 8 parental supply in unadjusted models.

One or two parent household

Parent-child relationship quality

Parental monitoring Family conflict

Parental discipline

Adolescent sex

Table 2. Grade 7 predictors of Grade 8 parental supply that became non-significant in adjusted model (aOR, 95% Cl).

Parent alcohol use (1.07, 0.99-1.15)

Externalizing behaviour (0.99, 0.96-1.02)

Peer alcohol use (Adolescent report) (1.03, 0.97-1.08)

Why did parents supply sips of alcohol and did it lead to drinking in Grade 8?

Parents who supply sips...

- Reported <u>parenting practices similar to parents who did not</u> <u>supply</u> (strong monitoring, discipline, close family relationships etc).
- More likely to believe that their child's friends used alcohol.
- May believe supplying a sip will protect their child from unsupervised drinking with peers.



Did supply of a sip increase risk of drinking...

- Were no more likely to go onto drink than sip in Grade 8.
- It was other factors <u>peers, externalizing problems</u> that impacted upon drinking versus sipping.

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
