Dr **Dimitris C. Anagnostopoulos** is Assistant Professor of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens. His current position is director of the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Unit of the Community Mental Health Centre of Byron-Kesariani, 1st Department of Psychiatry, Medical School, University of Athens. He is honorary Fellow Researcher, HSPR Department, Institute of Psychiatry, King's College, University of London. He is a graduate of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens, Medical School (1976) and his specialties are in Neurology and Psychiatry (1982) and in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry (1988). Also he is a graduate of the Hellenic Association of Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy (1996).

For almost thirty years, he has been practicing clinical psychiatry, child and adolescent psychiatry and psychoanalytic psychotherapy in the Greek National Mental Health System and since 1989, in the University of Athens. Also he is actively involved in the development of child and adolescent psychiatry in Greece and his membership of working parties and committees are among others: Membership (Vice Chairman) of the working party for the Development of Child and Adolescent Psychiatric Services in Greece, Ministry of Health, 2002-2004; Member of the Mental Health Committee, Ministry of Health, since 2005; Member of the Children's Rights Committee, Ministry of Youth, since 2008; Member of the Planning Committee in Health Education, Ministry of Health, since 2002; Member of the Education Committee, Hellenic Society of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry; Member of the Education Committee, Hellenic Psychiatric Association.
