EIP-AHA Action Group B3 on Integrated Care

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Objective of B3 Action Group

Reducing avoidable/unnecessary hospitalisation of older people with chronic conditions, through the effective implementation of integrated care programmes and CDM models, ultimately contributing to the improved efficiency of health systems

Targets

By 2015: Availability of programmes for chronic conditions/case management (inc. remote monitoring) serving older people in >50 regions, available to >10% of the target population

By 2015-2020: Based on validated, evidence-based cases, scale-up and replication of integrated care programmes serving older people, supported by innovative tools and services, in >20 Regions in 15 Member States

Themes

Development and dissemination of B3 Toolkit which will cover:

4. Integrated Care Pathways
1. ICT Infrastructure to support integrated care

Specifics

1. Promotion of successful models for integrated care.
1. Promotion of risk stratification tools and their impact on the delivery of integrated care.
2. Promotion of successful at-scale approaches to citizen empowerment.
1. Scale up of established integrated care pathways – building on AIRWAYS ICP model.
1. Promotion of Maturity Matrix for Integrated Care, with particular focus on ICT.

Are regions ready for scaling up?

Integrated care is being adopted at *different rates* and in *diverse ways* across regions of Europe. In developing the ***B3 Maturity Matrix***, we identified:

- ✓ What ***actions have the more progressive regions taken*** in order to be successful
- ✓ ***What we can learn from these pioneers*** about how to overcome barriers and accelerate results
- ✓ How these ***lessons*** can be ***structured into a conceptual 'maturity model'*** to help regions to speed adoption

How to reach the SIP Targets

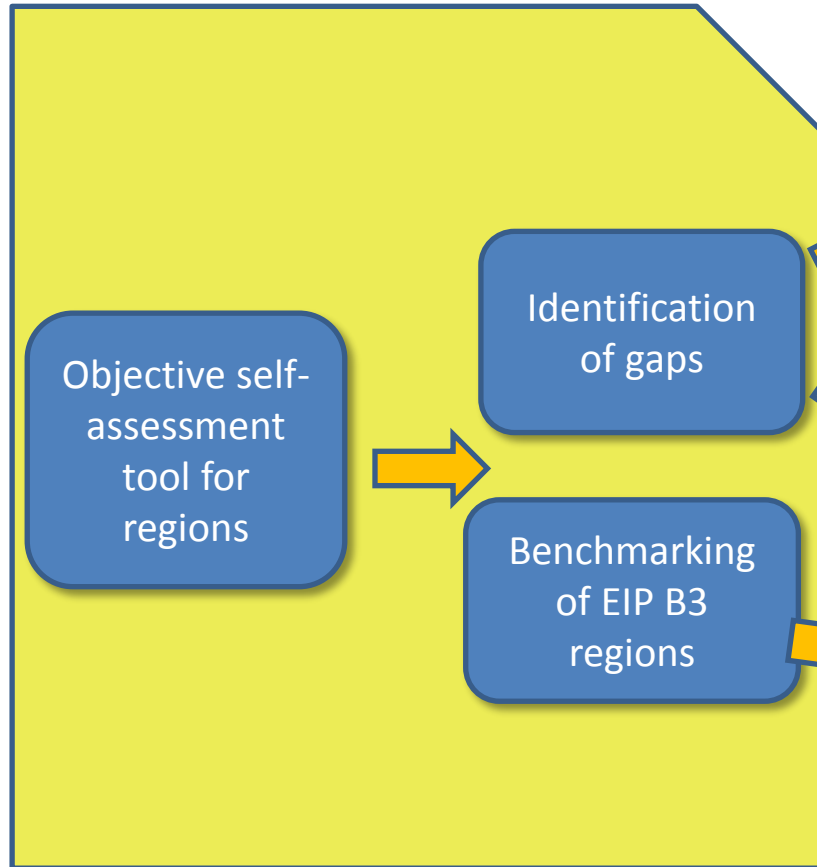
- ✓ Developing the individual commitments of the AG members – this will be the key focus of the new Action Group “Promoter”.
- ✓ Making B3 deliverables (Integrated Care Maturity Matrix, AIRWAYS Integrated Care Pathway, Risk Management Tools Analysis, etc) accessible to others.
- ✓ Finding support from EC to facilitate a process that allows coaching between partners experiences and sharing outcomes.
- ✓ Facilitating B3 members to access funding to support integrated care scaling up activities.
