# For Title IV programs...for each State in which the institution enrolls students:

- Authorization by each State.
  - A reciprocity agreement.

Effective date: July 1, 2018



# **Federal Regulations Update**



The New Federal Regulations for State Authorization (2016)

## **Public Notifications and Disclosures**

- Authorizations in each state with students.
- Adverse actions by a State or accrediting agency.
- Refund policies in a state.
- Licensure and certification requirements are met for each student's State? (location/residence) dual track?
- Student complaint processes in each state.







The New Federal Regulations for State Authorization (2016)

# **Direct Notifications and Disclosures**

- Program licensure or certification requirements.
- New adverse actions.
- Program ceases to meet licensure or certification requirements.

# **Federal Regulations Update**

The New Federal Regulations for State Authorization (2016)

## Possible futures for this regulation:

- Regulatory freeze pending review.
- Congress forbids spending on compliance.
- Higher Education Act Reauthorization
- Regulation stands and goes into effect on July 1, 2018.

# Misrepresentation - 34 CFR 668.71

Misleading statements or omissions.

To enrolled or prospective student.

 On which they could reasonably be expected to rely.

# **Current Federal Regulations**

Affecting eligibility to participate in Title IV, HEA programs

### Institutional Information – 34 CFR 668.43

- Contact information for filing complaints.
- Provided to students:
  - prospective and enrolled.distance and face-to-face.

# 5. Does your institution offer programs leading to **professional licensure** out of state?

Details will be provided in the next two presentations:

 NOW - SARA requires notification: whether the program meets the requirements of the state licensure board to sit for a license or certification in that state.

 July 1, 2018 – Federal regulations will require notification: whether the program meets the requirements of the state licensure board to sit for a license or certification in that state. (residence/location)



# Reading The Manual Is Important

### WHICH ACTIVITIES DOES SARA COVER?

- Online courses and programs
- Supervised field experiences
- Adjunct faculty in other states
- Recruiting (some limitations)
- Advertising
- IT servers in other states
- Field trips (not field studies)
- Offerings on military bases (some limitations)

- Short courses/Seminars (20 hrs. per 6 mos.)
- Tutoring (one-on-one)
- Proctored exams
- Contractual agreements in other states
- Minimal on-the-ground contact between faculty and students (not more than 6 hours over two class periods per academic term)

### WHICH ACTIVITIES DOES SARA NOT COVER?


- Establishing a physical location where students gather for instruction
- Requiring students to meet physically for instruction (two exceptions)
- Establishing an administrative office
- Provide office space to faculty or staff

- Phone number with an exchange in another state
- Mailing address for a physical address in another state
- Field studies/activities that exceed the rules pertaining to short courses

### Rule of 10!



- READ Manual, Section 5.13 d 1 which covers contracts for supervised field experiences (affiliation agreements, placement agreements, etc.)
- Placement of no more than 10 students from:
  - One academic program
  - Placed simultaneously at
  - One site
- UNLESS approval is provided by that state's SARA portal entity
  - SPE may object on two grounds relating to academic quality of the program
  - Regional compact will then determine if the placement is allowable
- N/A: Grandfathered placements, institution's own facilities
- Fed Law supersedes SARA policies (on same topic)




### **COMPLAINT PROCESS**

- READ Section 4.5 in the Manual (Under Consumer Protection)
- From students' perspective
  - Exhaust institutional process before going to SPE
  - W/I 2 years
  - No grade, conduct issues
  - Appeal to the SPE in the institution's home state
- From SPE's perspective
  - Investigation
  - Report to SPE in state where student is located, may assist
  - Decision final, unless a violation of law
  - How information is used by SPE



# The C-RAC Guidelines and SARA



examples of best practices - an institution does need to have all the bulleted examples in place in SOME manner

throughout the policies and guidelines of the regional accreditors – if an institution is regionally accredited, C-RAC compliance has been addressed. Be sure you can explain how.

compliance is summarized in one place – important for your signatory executive and if there is ever a complaint about compliance from a SARA student

Example: the dreaded 24/7 IT help desk bullet

#### Create

Create a close relationship with your Institutional Research Office – they are usually the folks who submit data to IPEDS


Fall

Fall full time FTE used to determine national SARA fees (and some state fees)

#### Report


Currently: Fall 100% online enrollments reported to NC-SARA each spring
