- Mold

- Asthma/Allergy triggers


HVAC

Most Common Source of IAQ problems!

- Lack of Outside Air = High CO₂ Levels
 - Failed equipment, residential-style thermostats
- Computer systems giving bad information!!!!
 - Physically look at dampers
- Reduced airflow
 - Dirty filters, blocked or diverted airflow
- Intakes near system or building exhausts
- Exhaust fans not operating




High CO2 = low/no outside air





Water damage

- Stop the source if possible
- Dry carpet and walls <u>ASAP</u>
 - Cut/drill holes in walls to dry wall cavity!!!!!!!
- Use fans to blow air onto wet materials
- May be safer to remove the bottom part of sheetrock wall to be sure remaining wall is dry.
 - Especially if wall is insulated.






Mold: Nothing New

- Biblical Reference -
 - Leviticus 13:1-47 and 14:33-47
 - Priests would order the contaminated areas to be cleaned/removed or the house to be burned.
- The "mummy's curse" from molds in the tombs

Mold – Outdoor Source

- Mushrooms, fungus, decaying plants
- Mold is everywhere!!!!!!

Mold

- <u>Water + sheetrock = Mold</u>
- Shutoff/remove/repair water source
- Dry out building materials within 48-72 hrs!
 - Extract carpets right away
 - Cut/drill holes behind base cove material.
 - May be able to prevent mold growth.
- Sheetrock is cheap!!
 - When in doubt, rip it out!





Mold Prevention

• Get airflow drying carpets and walls ASAP.



Mold Prevention

• Get airflow into wall cavity, under cabinets ASAP.





Mold Prevention

Remove wet sheetrock

• Look for evidence of animal activity

- Nesting
- Fecal matter

 - direct sunlight on thermostats









Asthma Triggers – Pet Dander



Allergens & irritants

Fragrances (perfumes, air fresheners, candles, etc.), house dust, cleaning chemicals ...







Communicate throughout the event

- Give updates what you've found and <u>not</u> found
- Be sure problem is resolved
 - Follow-up with those people/areas affected
 - Did odor return? Has the leak stopped?
- Don't assume "no news is good news".
 - Don't want to look like a whiner.
 - Why...you didn't fix it the first time.
- Have them contact you (or maintenance) as soon as issue recurs.
- Encourage communication good and bad.
