We are pleased to invite you to join the **face-to-face Bone Curriculum Symposium and the Pre-Symposium on Rare Bone Diseases** organised by the KBVR / SRBR Osteoporosis and Fracture Prevention Group at NH Gent Belfort in Ghent on **21 & 22 October 2021**.

The intention of the Bone Curriculum is to provide high quality continuous education for clinicians interested in, seeing or treating patients with osteoporosis or bone diseases and is a structured educational programme for rheumatology and other bone-interested medical trainees. In this context, the lectures mainly cover up-to-date basic knowledge, overviews and reviews.

The Pre-symposium course on Rare Bone Diseases intends to spread general information on rare bone, calcium and phosphate disorders to second-line clinicians and to be an educational platform for trainees and future bone specialists. One of its final goals is to increase knowledge and awareness about these disorders and consequently to shorten and improve the diagnostic journey of patients with rare diseases and their access to specialised care.
