After three years of development the new IMO/ILO/UNECE Code of Practice for Packing of Cargo Transport Units (CTUs) is now due for imminent release. Extensively revised and upgraded from the original 1997 CTU Packing Guidelines, the new Code has implications for everyone involved in CTU logistics, whether moving general cargo, refrigerated or dangerous goods, by road, rail or water, in containers, swap bodies, road trailers, tankers or rail cars.

As part of ICHCA's "Pack It In!" campaign for safe packing of CTUs, the CTU Packing Roadshow offers practical education and advice on the contents of the new Code, its impact, and how its new guidelines can be adopted into supply chain operations.

The day will include talks by an expert panel of speakers from ETS Consulting, TT Club, Exis Technologies, Cordstrap BV, the Freight Transport Association, and the UK Marine and Coastguard Agency. Through brainstorming workgroups, you can also have your say on key questions around disseminating the Code and training and educating packers.
