The California Forest Tour is a one-day immersive event that will take place on November 2, 2024, in an FSC-certified forest in Ukiah, California. This unique experience will provide an in-depth look into forestry practices, that focus on biodiversity, climate change adaptation, deforestation mitigation, supply chain transparency, and social upliftment initiatives.

Arrival Details: Fly from Los Angeles (LAX) to Santa Rosa (STS) on Friday, November 1, 2024.

Departure Details: The tour will end Saturday November 2, 2024, in the evening.

Who can attend? Anyone is welcome.

There is no cost to attendees, but please note that participants must book their own flights and accommodation.

What is included:

- Dinner on November 1 upon arrival in Santa Rosa
- Ground transportation from the hotel in Santa Rosa to the forest and back to hotel.

- Lodging in Santa Rosa/Ukiah (FSC recommends Vinter's Resort or Hilton Garden Inn Sonoma County Airport; FSC will send out a notice to participants if there is a hotel block discount).

What to Pack:

- Dress in layers (fleece, rain jacket, comfortable footwear).
- Don't forget to bring mosquito repellent, sunglasses, a refillable water bottle, and any necessary medications.
