## Pièces de danse | Dance Performance – Compagnie Bal des Philosophes

### Les chorégraphes | the Choreographers

**Laurent Cherlonneix** se définit comme un philosophe qui danse. Agrégé, docteur, qualifié Maître de Conférences dans trois sections du Conseil national des universités, il œuvre en philosophie de la biologie et du vivant en France et en Allemagne. Ancien athlète de compétition, formé en danse notamment auprès de Nina Dipla, il a participé à plusieurs performances en tant que danseur, coconcepteur ou professeur référent.

**Corinne Chambard** travaille la matière chorégraphique en tant que plasticienne. Elle est diplômée des beaux-arts de Marseille et de Berlin, formée notamment auprès de Gérard Traquandi et Georg Baselitz ; plusieurs de ses œuvres ont été acquises par des collections publiques ou privées et des musées. Professeure de philosophie et d'enseignement artistique, elle enseigne le dessin et la morphologie en interaction avec des danseurs.

### Les artistes | The Artists

Immersée dans la danse depuis l'enfance, **Yéhoudit Cohen** se forme à la danse classique avant de se tourner vers la danse contemporaine. Sa formation se double d'une recherche d'un mouvement harmonieux au travers de pratiques somatiques. Elle est aujourd'hui interprète, chorégraphe, professeure de danse et praticienne certifiée de la méthode *Feldenkrais™*.

Danseuse, performeuse, styliste, créatrice **Sari Laakso** est diplômée de l'Université des Arts (Uniarts), Académie de Théâtre, Département Danse, Helsinki, Finlande. Elle poursuit sa formation continue en France au Centre national de la danse et à la Ménagerie de verre et participe à plusieurs projets chorégraphiques et performatifs. En parallèle, elle travaille en tant que styliste-créatrice et conçoit également des costumes pour des projets de danse.

Danseuse-interprète et chorégraphe, **Léa Doussaint** s'attèle à partager et échanger, dans ses propres créations comme dans celles d'autres créateurs-ices, par le langage universel du corps sensible. Elle aime transcender les genres et nourrit sa créativité par sa rencontre avec le cirque, le théâtre et la musique. Elle collabore avec Laurent Cherlonneix et Corinne Chambard sur le spectacle *Le Bal des philosophes* depuis 2020.

Danseuse, danse-thérapeute, formée et diplômée au Conservatoire National de Rome (IT) en danse classique, **Sabina Borrelli** danse dans diverses compagnies (Cie nazionale del balletto, Cie Carla Fracci, fondazione Arturo Toscanini), compose des chorégraphies et enseigne la danse classique et moderne. Elle complète sa formation par un master en danse thérapie à la Sorbonne, des pratiques du mime et du tissu aérien et un travail corporel mené par Nina Dipla du TanzTheater Studio / Pina Bausch. Aujourd'hui elle enseigne la danse-thérapie et la méthode pilates et collabore avec la compagnie de théâtre - danse en Chantier(S).

**Léonard Cherlonneix** a participé depuis 2018 à la production du *Bal des Philosophes* comme danseur et

**Laurent Cherlonneix** defines himself as a dancing philosopher. He is a professor of philosophy of biology and living beings in France and Germany and is qualified as a *Maître de Conférences* in three sections of the Conseil national des universités. A former competitive athlete, trained in dance with Nina Dipla, he has participated in several performances as a dancer, co-designer or teacher.

**Corinne Chambard** works with choreographic material as a visual artist. She graduated from the fine arts schools of Marseille and Berlin and trained with Gérard Traquandi and Georg Baselitz. Several of her works have been acquired by public and private collections and museums. Professor of philosophy and art education, she teaches drawing and morphology in interaction with dancers.

Immersed in dance since childhood, **Yéhoudit Cohen** trained in classical dance before turning to contemporary dance. Her training was coupled with a search for harmonious movement through somatic practices. Today she is a performer, choreographer, dance teacher and certified practitioner of the *Feldenkrais™* method.

Dancer, performer, stylist, designer **Sari Laakso** graduated from the University of the Arts (Uniarts), Academy of Theatre, Department of Dance, Helsinki, Finland. She continued her training in France at the *Centre National de la Danse* and at the *Ménagerie de verre* and participated in several choreographic and performance projects. At the same time, she works as a stylist/creator and designs costumes for dance projects.

Dancer-performer and choreographer **Léa Doussaint** strives to share and exchange, in her own creations as well as those of other creators, through the universal language of the sensitive body. She likes to transcend genres and nourishes her creativity through her encounters with the circus, theatre and music. She has been collaborating with Laurent Cherlonneix and Corinne Chambard on the show *Le Bal des philosophes* since 2020.

Dancer, dance therapist, trained and graduated from the National Conservatory of Rome (IT) in classical dance, **Sabina Borrelli** dances in various companies (Cie nazionale del balletto, Cie Carla Fracci, fondazione Arturo Toscanini), composes choreographies and teaches classical and modern dance. She completed her training with a master's degree in dance therapy at the Sorbonne, mime and aerial fabric practices and bodywork led by Nina Dipla of the TanzTheater Studio / Pina Bausch. Today she teaches dance therapy and pilates and collaborates with the theatre-dance company - danse en Chantier(S).

**Léonard Cherlonneix** has participated since 2018 in the production of the *Bal des Philosophes* as a dancer and



guitariste. Il étudie en double cursus la danse au Conservatoire de Région (CRR de Paris) où il a choisi la filière danse classique, cette année auprès de Sandrine Hénault et Rosana Barbacaru. Il a aussi été reçu dans la filière danse contemporaine et pratique la guitare flamenco avec Alexandre Radot à l'École d'Art Musical.

**Philippe Démier** est le compositeur de la plupart des musiques du *Bal des Philosophes*. Diplômé du C.N.S.M.D. où il a étudié l'écriture, l'analyse, l'orchestration et la composition auprès de C. Ballif et M. Constant, puis à l'IRCAM avec T. Murail, Ph. Manoury et T. Mays. Son catalogue explore différentes formations - de la musique de chambre à l'opéra pour enfants. Ses pièces ont été interprétées lors de festivals, en France et à l'étranger. Professeur agrégé et titulaire d'un D.E.A, il enseigne dans le Master Musique à l'image à l'Université Paris VIII.

**Guitòti** est diplômé d'un DEM (diplôme d'études musicales) de percussions, du DUMI (diplôme universitaire de musicien intervenant) et d'un Master en Musicologie. Il s'intéresse très vite à l'univers du handpan. Sa passion tout autant que l'engouement mondial suscité par cet instrument l'ont mené aujourd'hui à être l'un des acteurs principaux en propositions de cours, ateliers, stages et concerts en France.

guitarist. He is studying dance at the Conservatoire de Région (CRR of Paris) where he chose the classical dance class of Sandrine Hénault and Rosana Barbacaru. He has also been accepted into the contemporary dance programme and practices flamenco guitar with Alexandre Radot at the École d'Art Musical.

**Philippe Démier** is the composer of most of the music for the *Bal des Philosophes*. He graduated from the C.N.S.M.D. where he studied writing, analysis, orchestration and composition with C. Ballif and M. Constant, then at IRCAM with T. Murail, Ph. Manoury and T. Mays. His catalogue explores different formations - from chamber music to opera for children. His pieces have been performed at festivals in France and abroad. He is an Associate Professor and holds a D.E.A. He teaches in the Master Musique à l'image at the University of Paris VIII.

**Guitòti** holds a DEM (*diplôme d'études musicales*) in percussion, a DUMI (*diplôme universitaire de musicien intervenant*) and a Master in Musicology. He quickly became interested in the world of the handpan. His passion as well as the worldwide craze for this instrument have led him to become one of the main actors in proposing courses, workshops, training courses and concerts in France.

## Les trois pièces représentées | The Three Dance Pieces

### Héraclite le fleuve | Heraclitus The River

Au commencement héracliteen était le souffle, un *rythme partagé en fait et en droit par tous les êtres qui se confond avec celui d'un fleuve universel* : « Nous entrons et nous n'entrons pas dans les mêmes fleuves ; nous sommes et nous ne sommes pas ». « Le temps est un enfant qui joue en déplaçant les pions : la royauté d'un enfant ». Dans ce tableau, le fleuve est le lieu de tous les mouvements. Tout se déplace dans une continuité inéluctable avec l'écoute répétée du souffle des danseuses, puissant et continu, comme des vagues. Des voix passent aussi en cascade, venant préciser dans différentes langues que rien n'est jamais permanent, que tout passe au moment même où les corps glissent et sont emportés par le devenir. Lorsqu'un jeu d'échec apparaît au son du métronome, c'est encore pour nous rappeler qu'à ce jeu de l'impermanence, toute vie se termine par un « échec et mat ! » asséné par... un enfant. *Héraclite le fleuve* propose une danse continue qui nous parle de la trame fondamentale des vies humaines et non-humaines que le droit international a peut-être aujourd'hui plus que jamais besoin de prendre en considération.

In the Heraclitean beginning was the breath, a *rhythm shared in fact and in law by all beings that merges with that of a universal river*. “We enter and we do not enter the same rivers; we are and we are not”. “Time is a child who plays by moving the pawns: the royalty of a child”. In this painting, the river is the place of all movements. Everything moves in an ineluctable continuity with the repeated listening of the dancers’ breath, powerful and continuous, like waves. Voices also cascade through, clarifying in different languages that nothing is ever permanent, that everything passes at the very moment when the bodies slide and are carried away by the becoming. When a chess game appears to the sound of the metronome, it is again a reminder that, in this game of impermanence, all life ends with a “checkmate!” struck by... a child. *Heraclitus the River* proposes a continuous dance that speaks to us of the fundamental weave of human and non-human lives that International Law today perhaps more than ever needs to take into consideration.

### Hegel la tornade | Hegel the Tornado

Inspirée par l'auteur des *Principes de la philosophie du droit*, la danse hégélienne se concentre sur des déplacements rythmés confiants en une harmonie dont le mouvement construit collectivement une assurance partagée. C'est avec le bleu le plus universel que ce tableau élabore un dialogue pluriel à trois mouvements dans une énergie joyeuse. La « tornade » de Hegel est une construction de marches qui parcourent la scène selon des figures circulaires, à la fois se construisant et se déconstruisant. Spirales et signes de l'infini dialoguent sans s'arrêter dans un système qui pourrait tout emporter mais qui trace sa mémoire dans l'espace. Les danseuses montrent ici le geste de s'accorder pour avancer collectivement et rationnellement, d'un même souffle, dans la même direction. L'enfant est la Raison au centre du processus qui inverse le sens des rotations et permet de penser en même temps ce qui se fait et se défait comme positif et négatif. La référence à la *Planetary Dance* d'Anna Halprin ou à la grande *Spiral Jetty* de Robert Smithson montre que la construction collective de la pensée - et pour Hegel du droit - ne peut se passer de son envers dialectique.

Inspired by the author of the *Principles of the Philosophy of Law*, the Hegelian dance focuses on rhythmic movements confident in a harmony whose movement collectively builds a shared assurance. It is with the most universal blue that this painting elaborates a plural dialogue with three movements in a joyful energy. Hegel's “tornado” is a construction of steps that run through the stage according to circular figures, at the same time building and deconstructing themselves. Spirals and signs of infinity dialogue without ending, in a system that could take everything away but traces its memory in space. The dancers show here the gesture of agreeing to move forward collectively and rationally, with the same breath, in the same direction. The child is the Reason at the center of the process which reverses the direction of the rotations and allows to think at the same time what is done and undone as positive and negative. The reference to Anna Halprin's *Planetary Dance* or to Robert Smithson's great *Spiral Jetty* shows that the collective construction of thought - and for Hegel of Law - cannot survive without its dialectical reverse.

### Nietzsche l'éclair | Nietzsche The Lightning

Un coup de marteau nous fait entrer dans le chaos nietzschéen qui ouvre ce troisième moment de danse. Le soleil tremble et la femme-philosophe avec lui. La radicalité de sa transe solitaire, dont la cause affectera aussi le public, la confronte à la société représentée par trois autres danseuses qui font irruption. Ce tableau explore la relation de l'individu au groupe, relevant le défi d'harmoniser l'intime et le collectif. Une danse sauvage et clanique au rythme d'une bacchanale provoque l'individu. Différentes réponses sont à l'épreuve au travers du cri et du rire. Mais en incorporant une danse commune et en se laissant guérir par la joie du collectif, l'individu surmonte ses pathologies et libère sa propre danse. Tel un envoi pour le colloque à venir, l'enfant, qui au départ tient le marteau, devient la figure de l'esprit parvenu à maturité et se révèle le soutien le plus précieux pour trouver l'harmonie.

A hammer blow brings us into the Nietzschean chaos that opens the third dance piece. The sun shakes and the woman-philosopher shakes with it. The radicality of her solitary trance, whose cause will also affect the audience, confronts her with society represented by three other dancers who burst in. This piece explores the relationship between the individual and the group, taking up the challenge of harmonizing the intimate and the collective. A wild and clanish dance to the rhythm of a bacchanal provokes the individual. Different responses are tested through shouting and laughter. By incorporating a common dance and allowing himself/herself to be healed by the collective joy, the individual overcomes his/her pathologies and liberates his/her own dance. As a sending off for the three-day symposium coming up, the child, who initially holds the hammer, becomes the figure of the mature spirit and proves to be the most valuable support in finding harmony.



## Orchestre de chambre | Chamber Orchestra – Sciences Polyphonies

Cette conclusion musicale est offerte par l'ensemble « Sciences Polyphonies », une association créée par des étudiantes et étudiants de Sciences Po Paris en septembre 2021. Il se donne pour mission de faire vibrer la musique classique dans le milieu universitaire à travers l'organisation de concerts de musique de chambre qui regroupent des étudiants-musiciens et solistes internationaux.

This musical conclusion is offered by the ensemble “Sciences Polyphonies”, an association created by students of Sciences Po Paris in September 2021. Its mission is to bring classical music to the university environment through the organisation of chamber music concerts featuring international student musicians and performers.

#### *Le Chant des oiseaux*

Symbole de la lutte contre toutes les formes de dictature et étroitement associée à l'amour de la paix, cette mélodie traditionnelle catalane fut interprétée par le violoncelliste **Pablo Casals** (1876-1973) à l'Assemblée Générale des Nations Unies le 24 octobre 1971.

A symbol of the struggle against all forms of dictatorship and closely associated with the love of peace, this traditional Catalan melody was performed by the cellist **Pablo Casals** (1876-1973) at the United Nations General Assembly on 24 October 1971.

#### *Hymne des Nations Unies (1971)*

Bien que les Nations Unies ne disposent pas d'hymne officiel, elles ont reçu de nombreuses pièces musicales dédiées à l'esprit de l'organisation notamment cette œuvre commandée par l'organisation et composée par Pablo Casals sur un poème de l'écrivain britannique **W.H. Auden**, lequel s'est inspiré du préambule de la Charte des Nations Unies. Elle fut interprétée également le 24 octobre 1971.

Although the United Nations does not have an official anthem, it has received numerous pieces of music dedicated to the spirit of the organisation, including this work commissioned by the organisation and composed by Pablo Casals to a poem by the British writer **W.H. Auden**, who was inspired by the preamble of the UN Charter. It was also performed on 24 October 1971.

## Compositeurs | Composers

### Pablo Casals (1876-1973)

Violoncelliste, chef d'orchestre et compositeur espagnol, Casals fut violoncelle solo à l'Opéra de Paris et créa divers ensembles dont l'Orchestre Casals de Barcelone en 1919. Outre sa carrière de concertiste qui l'a amené au-delà du répertoire classique pour son instrument par la création de nouvelles pièces musicales et l'exploration de toutes ses couleurs (notamment la *Sardane* pour 32 violoncelles), il dirige des orchestres internationaux prestigieux ainsi que de nombreux festivals. Après la guerre civile espagnole qui l'a profondément meurtri, il quitte sa patrie pour s'installer en France. Fervent défenseur de la liberté, il milite contre le régime franquiste. Il n'hésite pas non plus à prendre position contre l'arme nucléaire et à promouvoir la paix. Pour lui, « L'amour de son propre pays est naturel. Mais pourquoi s'arrêter à la frontière ? Nous sommes tous des feuilles du même arbre et l'arbre est l'humanité ».

Spanish cellist, conductor and composer, Casals was solo cellist at the Paris Opera and created various ensembles, including the Casals Orchestra of Barcelona in 1919. In addition to his concert career, which took him beyond the classical repertoire for his instrument by creating new musical pieces and exploring all its colours (notably the *Sardana* for 32 cellos), he conducted prestigious international orchestras and numerous festivals. After the Spanish Civil War, which left him deeply wounded, he left his homeland to settle in France. A fervent defender of freedom, he campaigned against Franco's regime. He did not hesitate to take a stand against nuclear weapons and to promote peace. For him, "Love of one's own country is natural. But why stop at the border? We are all leaves of the same tree, and the tree is humanity".

### Wystan Hugh Auden (1907-1973)

Poète, écrivain et essayiste britannique, Auden a vécu à Berlin pendant la République de Weimar et participé pendant plusieurs semaines à la guerre civile espagnole en assurant les fonctions d'ambulancier aux côtés des Républicains en 1937. Son œuvre a bénéficié d'un regain d'intérêt avec le film *Quatre mariages et un enterrement* (1994) au cours duquel son poème *Funeral Blues* est lu par l'un des personnages. Dans son travail de création, il collabore à plusieurs reprises avec des compositeurs dont Benjamin Britten et Igor Stravinsky. Le poème de l'Hymne des Nations Unies fut écrit à l'initiative du Secrétaire Général de l'ONU, U Thant, lequel avait sollicité Pablo Casals pour créer une œuvre originale à l'occasion de la journée des Nations Unies de 1971.

A British poet, writer and essayist, Auden lived in Berlin during the Weimar Republic and spent several weeks in the Spanish Civil War as an ambulance driver with the Republicans in 1937. His work was revived with the film *Four Weddings and a Funeral* (1994) in which his poem *Funeral Blues* is read by one of the characters. In his creative work, he has collaborated with composers including Benjamin Britten and Igor Stravinsky on several occasions. The poem for the United Nations Anthem was written on the initiative of UN Secretary General U Thant, who asked Pablo Casals to create an original work for the United Nations Day in 1971.

### Anne van Aaken

Anne was Vice-President of ESIL and Chair of the EUI Research Council. She taught as a guest Professor at numerous universities in Europe, Africa, Asia and Latin America as well as the USA (NYU). She is General Editor of JIDS and is or was a member of the editorial boards including AJIL, EJIL, International Theory and JIEL. She has been consultant for the IBRD, OECD, UNCTAD, GIZ and the UN.

### Golnaz Afraz

He was previously Full Professor at McGill University Faculty of Law, and Fernand Braudel Senior Fellow at the European University Institute, with other appointments at Yale Law School, Oxford University, Paris Nanterre, and Sciences Po. He previously served as the first Legal Advisor to the Prosecutor's Office of the International Criminal Tribunal for former Yugoslavia at The Hague (1994-2000).

## Thompson Chengeta



Thompson is a Reader/Associate Professor in Law and AI Technology at Liverpool John Moores University in England. Thompson studied law at Harvard Law School, University of Pretoria, and Midlands State University. He is an expert in international law, humanitarian law, human rights, and artificial intelligence. He has widely published in these fields. He serves as a legal expert for the International Committee for Robot Arms Control and the International Panel on the Regulation of Autonomous Weapons, organisations working in the framework of the United Nations Convention on Conventional Weapons. Thompson is the African Region Lead and Spokesperson for the Campaign to Stop Killer Robots – a coalition of more than 200 NGOs that are campaigning for an international treaty that bans autonomous weapon systems that are not under human control. Elle est désormais associée du cabinet JCD Avocats dédié au droit de l'exécution, du patrimoine et de l'immobilier.



### Matthias Fekl




## Judith Knieper

## August Reinisch

August Reinisch is a Professor of International and European law at the University of Vienna and a member of the International Law Commission as well as of the Institut de droit international. He is President of the Austrian Branch of the ILA.

He has published widely in international law with a focus on the law of international organisations and on international investment law and he is currently serving as the ILC's Special Rapporteur on the topic "The settlement of international disputes to which international organizations are parties".





### Yejoon Rim

Yejoon Rim is an Associate Professor at the College of Public Policy, Korea University. She holds a Ph.D. in International Law from the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies, Geneva. ### Anthea Roberts

Anthea Roberts is a Professor at the School of Regulation and Global Governance and Director of the Centre for International Governance and Justice at the ANU. ### Alejandro Rodiles



Professor Alejandro Rodiles holds the Chair of International Law at Friedrich Schiller University Jena. Previously, he was a Professor at ITAM School of Law, in Mexico City. He has been a research fellow at the Law Faculty of Humboldt University Berlin, a lecturer at Mexico’s National Autonomous University Faculty of Law, and a Visiting Professor at El Colegio de México. Alejandro is an associate fellow at the Berlin-Potsdam Research Group (KFG) – The International Rule of Law: Rise or Decline?, and an affiliated Professor at New York University’s Institute for International Law and Justice. His book *Coalitions of the Willing and International Law: The Interplay between Formality and Informality* (Cambridge University Press, 2018) was awarded the 2019 Book Prize of the European Society of International Law. His most recent publications deal with the role of cities in international law, contemporary development law, and global security law. He is a member of the Mexican Branch of the ILA and of ILA’s Study Group on Cities and International Law. Rodiles has served as a diplomat at Mexico’s Mission to the United Nations (2009–2010) and as a delegate to the UN Security Council. He holds a law degree from UNAM, completed postgraduate studies in German, European, and international law at Ludwig-Maximilians University, Munich, and obtained his Ph.D. at Humboldt University Berlin.

## Iliana Rodríguez Santibáñez

Sadat is an authority on public international law, international criminal law, and human rights with over 165 publications to her name. She launched the *Crimes Against Humanity Initiative* in 2008 which drafted a model global treaty on crimes against humanity and continues to advance this project at the UN. Sadat received the Alexis de Tocqueville Distinguished Fulbright Chair (2011), an Honorary Doctorate from Northwestern University (2017), and Chairs the ILA (American Branch).

### Constantinos Salomidis

Constantinos Salomidis is a partner and Global Co-Chair of the International Litigation & Arbitration Department of Foley Hoag LLP. His work focuses on the advice and representation of sovereign states before a broad array of international courts and tribunals, including the International Court of Justice. He has also represented several states in investment treaty arbitration matters involving a diverse range of industries. ### Philippe Sands

Philippe Sands, QC is Professor of Law at University College London and Visiting Professor of Law at Harvard Law School. He is a practising barrister at 11 King's Bench Walk and appears as counsel before the International Court of Justice and other international courts and tribunals. He sits as an arbitrator in international investment disputes and the Court of Arbitration for Sport.

He is author of *Lawless World* (2005) and *Torture Team* (2008) and numerous academic books on international law, and has contributed to the New York Review of Books, Vanity Fair, the Financial Times, The Guardian and the New York Times. His most recent books are *East West Street: On the Origins of Crimes Against Humanity and Genocide* (2016) (awarded the 2016 Baillie Gifford Prize, the 2017 British Book Awards Non-Fiction Book of the Year, and the 2018 Prix Montaigne) and *The Ratline: Love, Lies and Justice on the Trail of a Nazi Fugitive* (2020). His latest book is *The Last Colony: A Tale of Exile, Justice and Britain's Colonial Legacy* (2022).

Prof. Sands is President of English PEN and a member of the Board of the Hay Festival of Arts and Literature.



## Steven Sarangavany Sengayen

Steven Sarangavany Sengayen is an international lawyer and a Practicing English Solicitor of England & Wales and the co-founder and managing partner of Steven & Associates "International Law Firm" based in Mauritius. Steven is the Founder and currently the President of the Mauritius Branch of the ILA.




## Jennifer Tridgell


### Diane P. Wood


