Abstract	Three Aboriginal palliative care projects funded by the Victorian Government are
	currently being undertaken in Victoria. As part of this initiative, projects will report
	on their outcomes and learning to enhance access by Aboriginal and Torres Strait
	Islander people to specialist palliative care in Victoria. The Victorian Aboriginal
	Palliative Care Collaborative (VAPCC) has in this process of project oversight
	identified key learnings around the practical challenges faced by organisations when
	considering recruitment of Aboriginal people to undertake project officer and
	management roles. Initial findings are supported by research which suggests that
	recruitment and ongoing support need to be managed better by mainstream
	organisations. With many mainstream organisations establishing Aboriginal
	Employment Plans it is proposed there are implications for palliative care services
	who seek to include Aboriginal people within multidisciplinary palliative care teams.
