


ATA CARNET

• The **ATA Carnet** is an international customs document that permits the tax-free and duty-free temporary export/import of goods. It is currently acceptable in 78 countries/customs territories.

 Now we are digitalizing this paper document and its lifecycle management (eATA).





STEPS FROM PAPER TO DIGITAL

WCO started gathering key stakeholders to discuss the ATA Carnet digitalization. An eATA Working Group was created. ICC presented its concept of a centralized eATA solution which was supported by the eATA Working Group after a comprehensive comparison with other concepts presented before.

The very 1st eATA carnet transaction was completed in Switzerland using ICC's eATA carnet system. Other operations soon followed in Belgium, China and Russia.

ICC will focus on the Pilot expansion, system optimization and security audits to make it technically ready for production in 2023 (target). WCO will develop a Global Transition Plan for Customs authorities.

An eATA related article was added to the Istanbul Convention (art 21a) and the ATA Convention (art 4.3).

ICC's eATA technical infrastructure was developed. An eATA pilot project was established with the aim to test and improve the system before its full production.

WCO ATA/Istanbul Convention Administrative Committee approved a draft notification for activating the use of the eATA Carnet


- Deploy an ATA Carnet Lifecycle Management System (eATA System)

- Item 6: national issuing tool(s) integrated with ICC system.

THE TOOL FOR CARNET USERS








ATA Carnet App

A mobile application for carnet users (holders/representatives) to:

- download and store digital ATA carnets in the smartphone.
- prepare border crossing declarations via the app.
- obtain real-time transaction confirmation.



BENEFITS FOR CARNET USERS: NO MORE LOST CARNETS, HOLDERS CAN EASILY MONITOR THE DECLARATIONS MADE BY THEIR REPRESENTATIVES AND AVOID UNNECESSARY MISTAKES.


THE TOOL FOR CUSTOMS



ATA Carnet Customs

A turnkey application for Customs to use directly to:

- digitally review carnet declarations using the QR code or the transaction code submitted by carnet users.
- Confirm or cancel a carnet transaction with the relevant code.
- Detect potential claims through virtual voucher reconciliation.

CHALLENGES

1	Low transaction volume due to limited pilot participants
2	Difficulties during the COVID-19
3	Readiness of the issuing associations
4	Readiness of Customs authorities

ONBOARDING NEW PILOTS

Selection Criteria was updated to offer flexibilities in pilot participation:

- Case 1: Full participation Customs and NGA participate in pairs.
- Case 2: Partial participation NGA ready to participate.
- Case 3: Partial participation Customs ready to participate.
- Case 4: Partial participation Customs participate using demo carnets first.

TESTING DEMO CARNETS DURING THE COVID CRISIS

This is a new approach enabling Customs to test the system easily and quickly.

ICC's role:

- issue demo carnets.
- train NGAs and provide User Guides + training video.
- create accounts for Customs users.
- create a ticketing system.
- provide level 2 support.


NGA's role:

- be the country coordinator.
- train Customs users.
- Use the app to simulate and submit declarations.
- provide level 1 support to Customs users.
- keep ICC updated for the progress.

Customs' role:

- appoint a central contact for account settings, trainings, and support.
- test the system using simulated declarations prepared by the NGA.
- provide feedbacks to the NGA.
- finish tests on time.

LATEST PILOT DEPLOYMENT EXPERIENCE IN ITALY



SECURITY ASSESSMENT - STEPS

- Step 1 Security and privacy, GDPR compliance by design
- Step 2 Share a Security White Paper with Customs and request for comments (RFC) July 2021
- Step 3 External audit and pentests 30 September 2021
- Step 4 End of RFC 30 September 2021
- Step 5 Fixes and optimisations for the launch 31 December 2022
- Step 6 Continuous improvement / regular audits from 1 January 2023

TWO MILESTONES BEFORE THE FULL DIGITALIZATION

MILESTONE 1: NGAS/IAS ARE READY TO ISSUE eATA CARNETS.

- When? We target 2023. It needs the cooperation of the whole issuing network.
- How to achieve it? Integrate national issuing systems and create a Light Issuing Module for countries who don't have any issuing tools.

MILESTONE 2: CUSTOMS ARE READY TO ACCEPT EATA CARNETS.

- When? It is not fully under ICC's control.
- What has been achieved?
 - ✓ Modification of the ATA Convention (Art 4.3) and the Istanbul Convention (Art 21a). .
 - ✓ Adoption of a notification template.
- What is needed? A global transition plan
