



- Establishment of OSBP control







#### Example of Activities (Phase 3) in EA

□ Trade Facilitation Project in East Africa (BI, KE, RW, TZ, UG) – completed in Dec 2017

- Components:
  - Master Trainer Program (MTP)
  - > Risk Management
  - > OSBP
  - > Customs Agents

Simplified and Harmonized Procedures

- Development of Action plan, bilateral OSBP manual


- Training (422 officers & agents trained)
