Harmonisation: benefits

- Substantial transformation test would be clarified
 - legal certainty
- Import v. export dilemma

Rules would be available in every jurisdiction

Harmonisation: challenges

What are non-preferential origin rules used for?

- Origin at time of import/export declarations
- Trade policy measures
- Labelling: "Made in …"
 - Harmonisation possible?

Harmonisation example: EU

- Substantial transformation test remains the general rule
- Specific non-preferential origin rules only for certain products
- Initial attempt to have a specific origin rule for each and every product failed.
