## Fetal Status Data Analyzer



#### Computerized fetal monitor with automatic processing of the CTG

Unicos

Developed by: prof. V.N. Demidov, Moscow

During the use of Unikos the evaluation of fetus condition is measured according to the special index IFC (index of the fetus condition) which can vary from 0 to 4. IFC of 0-1 testifies normal fetus condition, IFC of 1.1-2.0 - initial (intermediary) deterioration, IFC of 2.1-3.0 - severe (abnormal) deterioration, IFC of 3.1-4.0 - extreme (preterminal) deterioration.

#### **ACCURACY OF ANTENATAL DIAGNOSTICS OF FETAL STATUS:**

The accuracy of correct assessment of fetal status – 90% Accuracy of diagnostics:

- Healthy fetus 91%
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In 75% of all cases the device can detect a healthy fetus as well as initial, severe and extreme deterioration.

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
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
