Data harmonization (steps)

- 1- Recommendation from WCO to Costa Rica
- 2- Understanding the WCO Data Model through a consulting work by Alejandro Rinaldi, for guidance in the WCO Data Model.
- 3- Mapping of each element of each process through the mapping tool "Customs Hub" to form the Mylp VUCE.
- 4- Participation in the 60th DMPT in April with 11 DMRs.
- 5- Currently completing the mapping of all the processes to complete the Mylp.

- 1- The "Single Declaration" project.
- 2- Learning and understanding the WCO Data Model.
- 3- Resources for its implementation (technical, monetary etc...).
- 4- Customs implementation.
