Part II: Research, Teaching, and Clinical Contributions

A. Narrative report of Research, Teaching, and Clinical Contributions

Over the past decade I have focused on the development of global child mental health programs. This has involved the development of a global database while at the World Health Organization from 2000 to 2005 and the support of multiple needs assessment research projects in developing countries. I have conducted research on the impact of the tsunami on the long-term mental health of children. Two current projects involve a country-wide needs assessment in China and the development of a community-based intervention for use in low resource settings involving Scouts.

The products have included reports and articles in peer reviewed articles and ongoing government consultations. The development of child mental health policy and the evidence for economic benefits of child mental health clinical intervention has also been a focus of attention and teaching.

Related teaching involves being the co-director of the international child mental health seminar series sponsored by Children's Hospital Boston, the Harvard School of Public Health and the Department of Global Health and Social Medicine at Harvard Medical School. I also direct the Global Child Mental Health Observership training program at Boston Children's Hospital and direct the Global Child Mental Health Initiative of the Harvard Center for the Developing Child.

I have taught in several sponsored courses in the developing world. Since 1975 Recent talks at the World Psychiatric Association regional meetings, the China Pediatric Elites Forum, the Initiative for Peace in Egypt and other meetings has focused on the need for rational care not focused on single diagnosis interventions such as PTSD.

At Harvard I supervise residents in clinical work and provide guidance on the development of international research projects. I have supervised theses at HMS and HSPH. I teach in the core child psychiatry training program at the MGH and Children's Hospital Boston. I serve on the International Committee of HMS which provides oversight of international experiences for HMS students.
