
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








The eTIR international system aims to ensure the secure exchange of data between national Customs the related systems international transit of goods, vehicles or containers according to the provisions of the TIR Convention and to allow Customs to manage the data on guarantees, issued by guarantee chains to holders authorized to use the TIR system (Customs to Customs).








CMRContracting Parties

- 29 Contracting Parties,
- out of those:
 - 4 (14%) ratified /acceded between 2008-2010;
 - **7 (24%)** acceded between **2011 2016**;
 - **18 (62%)** acceded between **2017-2020**
 - 1 has only signed but not ratified

Article 5

Implementation of the electronic consignment note

- 1. The parties interested in the performance of the contract of carriage shall agree on the procedures and their implementation in order to comply with the requirements of this Protocol and the Convention, in particular as regards:
 - (a) The **method for the issuance and the delivery of the electronic consignment note** to the entitled party;
 - (b) An assurance that the electronic consignment note retains its integrity;
 - (c) The **manner in which** the party **entitled to the rights arising** out of the electronic consignment note is able to demonstrate that entitlement;
 - (d) The way in which confirmation is given that delivery to the consignee has been effected;
 - (e) The procedures for supplementing or amending the electronic consignment note; and
 - (f) The procedures for the possible replacement of the electronic consignment note by a consignment note issued by different means.
- 2. The procedures in paragraph 1 must be referred to in the electronic consignment note and shall be **readily** ascertainable.

Article 6	18	The carrier shall hand over to the sender, at the latter's request, a receipt for the goods and all information necessary for identifying the shipment and for access to the electronic consignment note to which this Protocol refers
	19	The documents referred to in Article 6, paragraph 2 (g) and Article 11 of the Convention may be furnished by the sender to the carrier in the form of an electronic communication if the documents exist in this form and if the parties have agreed to procedures enabling a link to be established between these documents and the electronic consignment note to which this Protocol refers in a manner that assures their integrity


Gap Analysis between pilots performed on **CMR** so far and requirements





Gap Analysis between pilots performed on **CMR** so far and requirements











- There are no operations of eCMR so far agreed by CPs;
- No harmonized approach for eCMR implementation / High level architecture;
- All existing pilots do not serve / cover needs, requirements of all actors involved / interested to CMR;
- Integrity of data that would create international TRUST to the eCMR operations is required;
- Procedures for supplementing or amending the electronic CMR, procedures for the
 possible replacement of the electronic consignment, confirmation is given that
 delivery to the consignee, authentication of the signatures etc have not been
 discussed, harmonized and agreed.







 Decision has to be taken towards which direction the future eCMR system will be developed in order to:

To be considered an international sustainable approach;

To ensure mutual recognition / integrity of data / inalterability of messages

To follow the provisions of the CMR Convention and its protocol





Decision of SC.1





SC.1 decided to establish a formal group of experts on the operationalization of the eCMR procedure for 2 years (2022 and 2023) to discuss and if possible agree on the requirements of article 5 of the Additional Protocol to CMR including the objective/scope, the high level architecture, and the conceptual specifications for a future environment that would support the conclusion and exchange of electronic consignment notes in accordance with the provisions of CMR and its Additional Protocol. Such work should also include an impact assessment of possible implementation scenarios of a future eCMR environment.





The Group of Experts should define/describe in particular (non exhaustive list):

- Scope / Objectives of a future eCMR environment;
- Stakeholders of the eCMR environment:
- High level architecture of the eCMR environment;
- The method for the issuance and the delivery of the electronic consignment note to the entitled party;
- An assurance that the electronic consignment note retains its integrity;
- The manner in which the party entitled to the rights arising out of the electronic consignment note is able to demonstrate that entitlement;
- The way in which confirmation is given that delivery to the consignee has been effected;
- The procedures for supplementing or amending the electronic consignment note;
- The procedures for the possible replacement of the electronic consignment note by a consignment note issued by different means.
- Conceptual specifications;
- Impact assessment.
