Objectives

The Conference will thematically focus on Health, Climate Change, Energy and e-Infrastructures. ICRI 2012 will provide important input to the European strategy and to the implementation of the next EU Framework Programme “Horizon 2020”, supporting the strengthening of a global ecosystem of research infrastructures.

Ambition

The purpose of the Conference will be to make specific recommendations on how international cooperation on research infrastructures can be more effective in the future. This may include calling for a coordinated support and strengthening of existing initiatives, highlighting possible needs for additional efforts, and developing a vision of open science.

Therefore, there is an urgent need to discuss and find ways to act globally to respond to the Grand Challenges.

Participation

Participation in the Conference is free, but participants are expected to cover their own travel and accommodation expenses.

ICRI 2012 will be a dynamic and interactive conference: audience participation is encouraged and as such, time will be dedicated to open discussion.

Please join us in Copenhagen and share your thoughts and ideas. We look forward to seeing you and hope you enjoy your stay in Denmark.

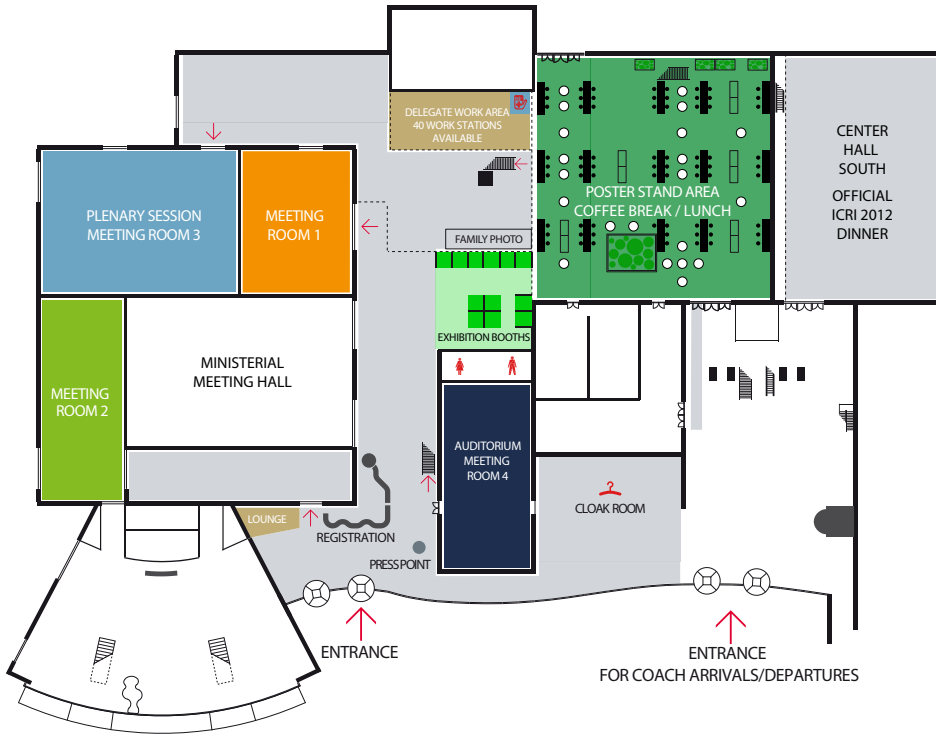

Metro line: Bella Center st (Metro M1)

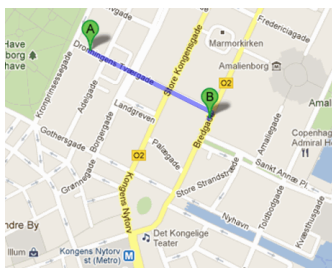
